O.M.E.G.A News!

The beginning of 2010 started off fast that involved O.M.E.G.A., the Greenwood Congregation, and the Franktown Group. For those who don't know who or what is O.M.E.G.A. It means Organizational Management for Emergency General Activity. O.M.E.G.A. has been working in partnership with Greenwood since 2008 and in 2009 with the Franktown Group.

O.M.E.G.A. is organized exclusively for the purposes of public safety in order to support emergency response organizations for training and at times of real crisis. The assets, equipment, personnel and resources of O.M.E.G.A. are dedicated to public service and education purposes. O.M.E.G.A. was created in 2006 to help plan the North Central Region (NCR consisting of the following counties: Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Broomfield, Clear Creek, Denver, Douglas, Elbert, Gilpin and Jefferson) with regional CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) emergency exercises. Greenwood has allowed O.M.E.G.A. to meet in one of the class rooms and Franktown Group helps provide the staff to facilitate these exercises.

On January 16th, 40 members within the NCR converge on Greenwood to participate in a table top exercise called "Chills and Thrills". A table top exercise is basically a mind game. The participants were divided into 7 groups. The scenario was a mysterious pandemic (aka The Virus). Each group was given the assignment, starting from Greenwood and virtually goes to another location and explains how they would set up a Red Cross Shelter. They had to describe to their group facilitator how they would get there, what supplies they may need, how they believe they can protect themselves from a mysterious virus, how to communicate with the other groups (they can only use their cell phones once, so their options were limited to the internet,

Apparently the exercise was a success, as the participants wanted to know when the next one will be scheduled.

On February 13th, Greenwood was again hot zone of disaster as the congregation hosted another Denver University CERT Class. 18 Students were subjected to a number of trials, but all passed.

On March 27th, O.M.E.G.A. and the Franktown Group offered for the second time, First Aid and CPR course to the Greenwood Congregation and the surrounding community. We had 10 students.

On April 25, we provided the CERT team at the St. Catejan Church a proof of concept on how HAM Radio can enhance their operations during their children's festival (over 500 people celebrating).

They were sold in 30 minutes!

The K7RA Solar Update

10 meters opens cross-Atlantic

10/15/2010

Solar activity dropped again this week, although it is now gradually strengthening. The average daily sunspot numbers declined nearly 16 points to 11.7, and average daily solar flux dropped more than 5 points to 75.8. Over the next two weeks, the solar flux is expected to gradually increase from 80 on October 15-16, 82 on October 17, 84 on October 18-22, 80 on October 23-25 and 85 on October 26-29.

Sunspot numbers for October 7-13 were 0, 11, 12, 13, 11, 11 and 24, with a mean of 11.7. The 10.7 cm flux was 75.1, 74.9, 76.4, 75.9, 75.3, 75.2 and 78.1, with a mean of 75.8. The estimated planetary A indices were 4, 4, 4, 2, 20, 10 and 4, with a mean of 6.9. The estimated mid-latitude A indices were 2, 3, 3, 1, 10, 7 and 3, with a mean of 4.1.

operated at low power (2x points multiplier) on 100% emergency power using generators, batteries, and solar panels.

The GOTA (Get On The Air) demonstration station, KCØMO, made over 500 contacts by 22 youth and visitors with 15 licensed coaches using CW (Morse Code), Phone, and PSK31 digital modes.

Several Boy Scouts passed their Tech license after they camped with us all weekend last year. Some of them have already upgraded to General Class.
